## Colonel Kyle D. Campbell

Kyle graduated from SUNY Binghamton and was commissioned as an Army Nurse in April 1985. After an assignment to Honduras he transferred to the Medical Service Corps and became a Blackhawk Helicopter Pilot flying medical evacuation missions in the U.S. and overseas including Iraq, Germany and Korea.

He earned Master's Degrees in Administration from Central Michigan University, in Health Administration from Baylor University, and in National Resource Strategy from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, Washington, D.C. He authored numerous professional articles in military and civilian journals including The U.S. Army Medical Department Journal, Army Logistician, and The Journal of Surgical Research.

Kyle spent 10 years as a Commander (CEO), culminating as the first Medical Service Corps officer to Command the 7,800 staff of Brooke Army Medical Center (BAMC) at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. During his tenure the BAMC Team achieved unprecedented increases in quality, productivity and performance and was recognized as the Army's cornerstone for wartime medical skill sustainment. From the Hospital to the six geographically separate Clinics to the world-renowned rehabilitation facility, the Center for The Intrepid, BAMC is rightfully known as the place "Where The Amazing Is Routine"!
